






4. How many employees does your business have?

6. How has the COVID-19 emergency affected your operations and revenue?




early to determine, business based on events which has been dramatically reduced, still operating but transactions have been cancelled or postponed, no change, too early to say.

7. How long can you continue operating under current emergency conditions before you must change your business operations?




Comments: we have already laid off and furloughed, I have zero income and paid full rent April 1st.


8. Have you had to lay off or furlough any employees due to the emergency?




9. How many have been laid off?




10. How many have been furloughed?



11. Have you had to change employee compensation?




12. How have you changed your employee compensation?






14. Have you had to draw additional funds to continue operating your business during the emergency?




15. Where have you had to draw additional funds to continue operations?




